Description: ‘Visual supports (VS) are concrete cues that provide information about an activity, routine, or expectation and/or support skill demonstration (pg 129 Evidence-Based Practices for Children, Youth, and Young Adults with Autism 2020 report).’ Come explore the variety of visual supports and how they can benefit a variety of learners, not just students with autism. We will also discuss how to effectively implement the visuals so they can be an effective tool for your learner.

Throughout the workshop we will have time for you to reflect on the content and make a plan for how you will apply the information in your own setting. As time permits we will also provide opportunities for you to begin creating the materials so you can collaborate and get feedback. The topics we plan to explore include but not limited to

- Common visuals used to support learners with autism
- Effective use of classroom, individual, and mini-schedules to promote independence
- Types of visuals that can help promote executive functioning
- Use of video modeling to teach skills
